Sir The Council of Safety has agreed with Mr. Joseph
Hollingsworth to send a quantity of flour from Baltimore
Town to Pitt's Landing, to be carted across from thence
to Chango League - Inlet, to be put on board the schooner
John, Captⁿ Speake, now lying there - We therefore request
the fav^r: of you to give Captⁿ Speake, or Mr. Beech
every friendly assistance in your power to convey the
said flour from the Landing across to the vessel - the favour
will be acknowledged, and any reasonable expence, which
you may incur therein, will be paid by us, as this vessel
is loading on Account of the Province.
