Humanity will interest you so far in favour of  
the sick, as to have all the care taken of them,  
you can - we have heretofore wrote you,  
about the Cannon coming up by water, after the  
Departure of the enemy. *Wearry*

P.S. We have some Powder and small  
arms arrived at Nicomaco on Aug<sup>1</sup>,  
as you will see by the inclosed Receipt, I  
should be glad of yr<sup>o</sup> Opinion how we could  
convey it across in the safest manner  
to the Maryland side of Potomack  
31<sup>st</sup> July 1770
