subsistence. By the orders of Congress the militia
of the Delaware Camp are not to be allowed any pay
or rations, until they are properly accounted for,
and march to the Northward, and as our Convention
did not give any particular directions to the Council
of Safety about them, we have not thought it proper
to order them to be taken into barracks, or subsisted,
however as y^r Company may be very serviceable here,
provided they will assist in working on the fortification
in & about this city, which we presume they will
not object to, we will take them into barracks,
and give them all the assistance we can in getting
arms &c.
