Company stationed at Park 902, to St. Marys, but
have ordered Capt. Hornet to take Capt. Thomas's
Station, and we must depend upon the militia's lending
Capt. ~~Thomas's~~ ^{of Forest's} Company arms, until we can supply them,
which we expect will be soon, expecting some arms from
Virginia that you have lately imported.
