Gentlemen,

We approve very much of what you have done and send you five hundred Pounds currency by Captain George; you will be pleased to purchase all the guns & blankets you can for the use of the Province; there are not enough to be had here and are greatly wanting - cartridge Boxes, Bayonets, Belts and Gun Slings are sent up to Chester Town for the Captain whose Companies and Colonel Richardson has Order to distribute them among his Battalion - Bantam are high We have a Number of Workmen engaged in making Wooden Bottles at two Shillings; - a few at two Shillings and two pence - and hope to supply you from Kent - Intlosed is an Order of
