to notify this to the commander, and direct him to return to
Schooley, or Mem: of Gun, and other Effects on board, the price
we will send hereafter. — Blankets we have none, but we will
furnish Mr. Griffen with Cotton to make them, which may be
easily done, for the shift we are forced to make for our own
hospitals, as also enough to make two for your Stewart, which
may be returned in kind, when convenient.
