In Answer to yours of 15th by Capt. Furnival we are to inform you that we expect some Clothing every Day from Virginia which in all probability will do very well for your Men, The Leather Breeches you may get for your Company they paying ten Shillings as Capt. Furnivals do - Indeed in an Order on the Assembly for Linnen for Shirts - The Increase of Pay is now an Object of Consideration with the Assembly & we doubt not will take place, Our Application to the Articles of War must be made by the general Assembly & upon a proper Representation of the Inconvenience you mention, probably they will come into it
