oblige Mr. Mure to deliver up his Books before a Settlement, a Copy of them you are  
entitled to; and if he does not either Settle his Accounts immediately, & deliver his Books  
or a Copy of them, inform the Council thereof, such steps will be pursued as will insure

An unhappy affair has lately happened in Martinico by the imprudence  
of Captain Patterson in a small Privateer from this State he contrary to Law of Nations  
having taken an English Vessel under a Flag of Truce, within a small Distance of that  
Island to make satisfaction for which outrage the Continental and our Agent there  
have been obliged to give their Bond for the Payment of the Vessel and Cargo so  
seized within three Months from the Date thereof.

We therefore desire you'll remit to those Agents the  
Sum of fifteen hundred Pounds continental Currency if in your power or take the  
necessary Steps to enable to them to pay that Sum within the Time limited, and charge
