Sir, Mr. Young has put into our hands an Extract from a Letter that you received from a Mr. Stevenson in relation informing you of 2 Charts of Two Bales having been shipped by him on account of the State of Captain Arubin Parcilled to Carolina and that by your desire he had reserved one Bale to pay charges — Mr. McCreary has informed us that he shipped from Rotterdam Lining articles as mentioned below on Account of this State (Adolphus) to Mr. Vanbibber & that they had arrived safe but as yet we have not received any advice from him of the Transaction. We must beg the favour of you to inform us as explicitly as you can of such particular as have come to your knowledge respecting this business and also in what part of Carolina Captain Parcilled arrived and whether any Arms or goods are arrived in James River belonging to Maryland that you have heard of.

Mr. Young informs me that he sent a package of (Medicines) belonging to this State at Pittsburgh. Be so kind as to make inquiry and have proper care taken of it and advise us thereof enclosed you have an Extract from Mr. McCreary's Letter of the goods he shipped to this State.
