Gentlemen

Matters of an interesting Nature  
require my Attendance in England, and the present Receipt  
of Summs enables me to undertake the Voyage with little  
inconvenience to my private Affairs. I propose returning early in  
the Spring, and have Indiments to believe that I shall  
have an opportunity of condoning some Summs to the general  
Cause of the Colonies in the present exigency of the  
War, my Voyage is deemed unprop. I shall decline any  
further Thoughts of presenting it.
