

Resolved that Mr. Judge be permitted to export the

Resolved that Mr. Judge be permitted to export the
produce of Manufactures of the Province of Maryland (such
as Tobacco, Sugar, &c.) excepted being put on board
wharves (except to Great Britain, Ireland, the British
India and British West Indies, and for the supply of the
British Army or Navy in America) to the amount of the
Customs imposed by him into the said Province, the said Value
to be ascertained by the Committee of Regulation and Administration
for the County of Baltimore.

Resolved nevertheless that the Indulgences
in this Island ought not to be drawn into Example, the
same being granted to Mr. Judge on account of the peculiar
Circumstances of his Case, and that the said (Mr. Judge be)
enjoined by the aforesaid Committee of Baltimore to avoid
if possible all British Ships of War and armed Vessels
on his Voyage.
