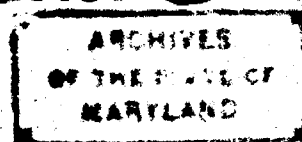


that it should be so managed as to

It is therefore Resolved that he
acknowledge that he was guilty of an Offence that
might have been of dangerous Consequences, and
ask Pardon at the Hands of Capt. Smith's Company
upon Payment of all Expenses attending the same
and otherwise complying with the above Resolves that
he be discharged from Custody.

Friday 5th April 1776.

Present as yesterday.

Permit was granted to William Logan to pass
with his vessel and a Cargo of goods to John's Hall in
the Colony of Virginia, he having taken the
necessary Oath that he will not carry any letters
concerning Intelligence directly or indirectly to
any Person or persons inimical to America.
