enat attempt in Possmike River. That the goods of M. Harman, and others were all seited by the Lord Baltemores Assembly at length after three yeares susse ing, Captaine Claiborn was forsibly distributed and disposses of his plantation in Kentish Island; and forced for safety of his life to fly into England, and ever since the L:B. hath had possession of the said Island, not suffering any of the Virginians to trade in the said Bay without ceisure, and confication of their Goods.

It likewise appears unto this Committee upon perusal of the several parchments mentioned in the Order of Parlament, that the L: B. hath constituted forms of Oaths, and injoyned the taking thereof by all persons as well Official, as others within the said province, and that not to the King, but to himself, and that he hath issued out Writs in his own name, all his Commissions and processe running in this stile (viz.) we, us, and given under our hand, and greater seal of arms in such a year of our Dominions over the said Province That he hath likewise appointed an upper & lower house of Assembly and also a privice counsel of State, which is not mentioned in the said patent. And we surther find that several of the Laws made by the said Lord Baltembre are not a precable to the Laws, Statutes, and customes of England, as for instance.

That the Lands sold by the sad Lord Baltemere are diread tobs purchased, and held of him, and his Heirs only in

soccade as of the Mannor ore.

That the Oaths hereafter mentioned must be taken by all that shall bear Office, or shall inhabite, or come into the said province upon pain of e being banished, and if they return, and resule, to be subject to such Fine as his Lordship shall think sit,
