Commission granted to the said Captain Green, and appointed one Stone in his room: but there is no such cause mentioned in the said Writing.

It likewise appears, That in March 1651. the Governor and Councel of Maryland, being required by the Commissioners that were sent thither, to issue forth Writs in the Name of The Keepers of the Libertie of England; they resuled the same, saying, They could not do it without breach of their Trust and Oath.
