

## Captain William Stone's

## RESIGNATION

of the

## GOVERNMENT.

Hereas since the Orders or Directions of the Commissioners of the State of England for the Government of this Province of Maryland, of the 28. of June, 1652. I William Stone Esquire, Governor of the said Province, was Enjoyned by the Direction, and Appointment of the Right Honorable, the Lord Baltamore, Lord Proprietary of the said Province, to issue out all Writs, and Process, within this Province, in his the said Lord Proprietaries name, and to admit of those of the Councel which were appointed by his Lordship, and no other: And whereas upon my Compliance with his Lordships Commands therein, not any wayes contradictory, so far as I understand, to any Command from the Supream Authority in England; the said Commissioners, in pursuance of their Declarations lately here published, have threatned, and gone about by force of Arms to compel me to decline his, the said Lord Proprietaries, Directions and Commands before mentioned; which in regard of the
