restissed by divers Merchants and others to be true.

In this expedition to Virginia Captaine Dennis and Capaine Steg the two chiefe Commissioners (who were preent when Mirsland was struck out of the said Instructions) were cast away outward bound, in the Admirall of that fleet which was sent from hence upon that service, and with them the Originall Commission for that service was oft.

But Capt. Curtes having a Coppy of the said Commissin and Instructions with him in another ship, arrived safe a Virginia, and there being also nominated in the sayd commission two other persons resident in Virginia, that is, Ir. Richard Bennet besore mentioned, and Capt. Cleyborne known and declared Enemies of the Lord B. Lemores) they bgether with Capt. Curtes proceeded to the reducement f Virginia. which was effected accordingly; and Captaine cone being then the Lord Baltemores Lievtenant of Maryind, did actually assist them therein. After all which, the yd Mr. Bennet and Capt. Cleyborne went notwithstanding Maryland, and upon pretence of a certaine Clause in their structions, That they should reduce all the Plantations in he Bay of Cheseapeacke, to the obedience of the Parliament, ecause some part of Maryland, where the Lord Baliemores hiete Colony there is seated, is within that Bay, aswell sall the Plantitions of Virginia are, they required Capt. sone and the rest of the Lord Baltemores Officers there, first nd declared, that they did in all lumility submit themlives to the Government of the Common-wealth of Engnd; in chiefe under God: then the said Comm ssioners. quired them to issué cut Writs and Processe out of the Lurd.
