pleasure but in a moment perissh, and the rest live secure and hap-  
pie. My Lord I am an absolute stranger heere as yet having not  
keene a monh in the Countrie, in which time this unfortunat  
action falle out, so muche the sadder, in regard of the common enemie  
the Indian who ever takes advantage by our intestine troubles be-  
ing both cruel and patient, & therfore I hope will be a motiue to fur-  
ther the charitable condiscending of your Highnesse for settling the  
Country. My Lord having had a very tedious passage being neces-  
sitated to stay above two monlhs in Bermudas & above one monlh  
in Virginia, so that I was above halfe a yeare from the time that I  
came out of England to my arival in Maryland, at which arival  
I found the Country in a great disturbance, the Governoour Captain  
Stone being ready to march with his Army (which heere is consi-  
derable if it consist of 200 men) against a partie of men at a place  
called Anne-Arundel abo the yeer before (pretending a power from  
your Highnesse as also that your Highnesse had taken the Lord  
Baltemores Country from him) bred a great disturbance in the  
Country, and withall tocke away the Governoours Commission from  
him, which Governoour being since informed by a Gentleman by name  
Mr. Elkynhead (one that came out of England 2 or 3 Monlhs  
after me) that the Lord Baltimore kept his Patent, and that  
your Highnesse had neither taken the Lord Baltemores Patent  
from him nor his Land, bee thought hee might act by the contents of  
his former Commission from the Lord Baltimore and accordingly  
ment up to reduce those people to the Lord Baltimore's Governe-  
ment, but still under your Highness command, as formerly under  
the Kings, having bee in the Country before I came first solemnly  
proclaymed you Highness, as also in all Proclamations and publick  
Edicis ending with God preserve the Lord Protector, and the  
Lord Proprietary. Now going up to reduce th se people, if possible
