BY knowing whit Tobicco there is upon Hind at any U.me, and the Namber and Burtaen of Ships gone out for the enforce Year, we shall be enabled the better to judge what Measures to take in respect to the Urise.

WI might also settle a good Correspondency with the Merchants in the Out-Ports, by communicating Thoughts and Advice, by Letters directed to each that, prepared by our Socretify, and Signed by the State of the Minights, or by their Direction, only by the State from the Out-Ports, to be directed to the Secretify, to be by him communicated to the Mannigers.

I think we should, is a Rody, sertle a Correspondency with our Principils. I know nor how it is in Parana, but in Maryland I am told there are fouled Clabs in every County, where they talk over Africa-With these Clubs, I think would be our mutual Interest to communicate Councils. I make no doubt what Advice they should have from us, as a Body, would have a great Weight to remedie many Evils we have long complained of, which only lies in Their Power to cure; as, mending the Quality, and Teilening the Quantity of Tobacco, giving the Ships hetter Disputch, and better Freight too; which I am hopeful they would not begrudge, when they faw as to much in Earnest to advance Tobacco, and put the Trade upon such a Foot as they may live comfortably by their Libour. I make no doubt when they feel the good Effects of our Agreement. they will think it unreasonable we should be so great Sufferers by our Ships as we have been of late Years, which pur nothing in their Pockets, tho it has taken a great deal out of ours, and chiefly by the unaccountable Delay, and extravagant Charge in Loading : The Delay has been many Ways to their Detriment as well as ours; the Tobacco spoilt by
