THAT the Managers or any Five of them, be appointed to view every Loading of Tobacco,

as foon as Landed, and before Sold.

THAT they fort the Tobacco according to its Nature as above described, etc. Three Sorts

Colour and Dry Tobicco, Three Sorts Leaf, and

and the very worst of all.

THAT the Managers report in Writing, the

Quantity and Quality of each Ships Loading.

THAT the Merchant or Importer, be oblig'd to make good to the Proprietors of the Tobacco, the Price settled, and as much more as the To-

. bacco Sells for.

THAT the Tobacco now on hand, be view'd, forted and valued by the Managers; and a Report

thereof made to the next general Meeting.

THESE Proposals were accordingly hid before the whole Body of the Tride, on the Second of May: And by a Letter of that Day's Date from Mr. Hyde to me, which I received in the Downs, he Says, " That my Proposal, as it stands in Blank, was received and referred to the Confideration of the Managers, with less Opposition than I expected, tho' a great many Objections were railed, which
