THE REFOS Let us, as one Man, put our Shoulders to the Work, and endeavour to encourage and assist one another in any Thing may be wanting. Ways may be found to make keeping our Tobacco 2 Time, not over burthensome to any of our Number.

AS we have made a Beginning, and gone so far; should we now flag and recede, our later End will be worse than our Beginning; our Losses will be doubled, we shall be laugh'd at for a foolish, unsteady People: and only fit to be made burthen-bearers.

THE REFORK, if we must think of other Methods than a friendly Treaty, I shall like *Some* *Head's* Proposal very well, so far as it relates to the several Sorts of Leaf. I wd for my own Part readily come into it; I don't care who are the Viewers.

AND I hope every other Merchant will do the like: It will certainly do the Work, and may be done, with no great Trouble.

FOR every Merchant may himself, from his other Tobacco sort out the Three sorts of Leaf, and have them ready for the View.

THAT can hinder no great Time; for, upon Notice over Night, Three of the Managers, or whoever shall be appointed for that Work, may the next Morning be at his Houle, and do what they need do in a small Time: For, in Respect to Leaf, I do not think it necessary to take Marks and Numbers, the Quantity and Quality of each Sortment, will be enough; we must take one another's Words and Honour, for faithful Performance of Agreements.
