

Tobacco he has sent to *Holland*, he has by Pub-
 lick Sales, stuck up a Publick Sales, kept con-
 tinually feeding the Market, and forcing the To-
 bacco all at one Price, (no matter what) brought
 the Market to a very low Price, which has discour-
 aged all other Buyers, and that was what he
 aimed at: by that Means he is in a Manner, be-
 come the sole Buyer, and has had Tobacco at his
 own Prices, upon Pretence of the Lowness of the
Dutch Market, considering how much he lost
 by what he sent to *Holland*, and yet at the same
 Time will not forbear sending to *Holland*, well
 knowing should he do that, the Market would
 soon get up, which would spoil his Project, by
 which he receives his Annual Yers, the *East India* Com-
 pany in *France*, five Yearly from forty to fifty
 Thousand Pounds Sterling.

France consumes Yearly I believe, not less than
 Twenty Thousand Hogsheads of our Tobacco;
 now supposing they were to buy none but what
 actually went to *France*, which is the Leisly Sort-
 ment, and were to give Three Pence Half Penny,
 and so up to Four Pence, which formerly used to
 be the Medium Price, the odds between those
 Prices, and Two Pence Fitting, the now
 current Price, would, I think, fall not much
 short of my Computation; so that the *French*
 are much in the Right, to order their Agent
 to go to work the Way he does; for without
 any Loss to them, he can keep the *Dutch* Mar-
 ket low enough, and supposing they should loose
 Five Thousand Pounds, by what went to *Hol-
 land*, they will save Ten Times as much, by
 what they consume themselves in *France*, and that
 is Temptation enough, and too plainly the Case:
 By these Methods, the *French* not only rob you of
 so much Money Yearly in what they buy themselves,
 but likewise upon all the Tobacco imported into
 Great
