Could we have fuch Letters from every County in Maryland, would be best, but as every Thing must have a Beginning, I shall be glad to fee it come from Marlbro; as that is the chief Place of Paturent, will have great Weight, and be a good Fx imple to other Places, and the fooner fomething comes to us from you, will be the better.
