to answer his Majesty's Royal Expectations, we do pray that it may be En-

acted,

XXIV. AND be it Enasted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by and with the Advice and Conjent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the Same, That the Sum of Fourteen Thousand Six Hundred and thirteen Pounds, or as much thereof as may be necessary, shall be applied to the Levying, Cloathing and Paying of Four Hundred Men, Officers included, to be employed in North-America, under the supreme Command of his Excellency General Amberst, or any other Person duly authorised, in such Manner as he shall judge most conducive to the said important Purposes of defending this Part of his Majesty's Dominions, and securing the Possession of his Conquests in North-America, until the First Day of April, in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-three, and no longer, unless his Majesty's Commander in Chief, or other Person properly authorised, shall think fit to dismiss the said Men, or any Part of them, before that Time, which said Men shall be paid by Muster-Rolls, to be taken and returned in the same Manner as is used and practised among his Majesty's Regular Forces, after the following Rates; That is to say, To four Captains, each having the Command of Ninety-nine Men (Officers included) Ten Shillings per Day: To eight Lieutenants, each Six Shillings and Eight Pence per Day: To Four Ensigns, each Five Shillings per Day: To Sixteen Serjeants, each One Shilling and Six Pence per Day: To Sixteen Corporals, each One Shilling and Two Pence per Day: To Four Drummers, each One Shilling and Two Pence per Day: To Three Hundred and Forty-eight private Men, able bodied, and fit for Service, Nine Pence per Day: To a Surgeon, Seven Shillings and Six Pence per Day: To a Surgeon's Mate, Four Shillings per Day.

XXV. AND be it Enasted, That all and every the Officers and Soldiers aforcsaid, shall, whilst in the Pay of this Province, by Virtue of this Act, be liable to martial Law and Discipline, in like Manner, to all Intents and Purposes, as the British Forces are by the Statute Laws of Great-Britain, now in Force.

XXVI. AND whereas the better to facilitate this important Service, his Majesty has been graciously pleased to leave it to his Excellency Horatio Sharpe, Esq; Governot and Commander in Chief in and over this Province, to issue Commissions to such Gentlemen of this Province, as he shall judge from their Weight and Credit with the People, and their Zeal for the Publick Service, may be best disposed and enabled to quicken and effectiuste the speedy Levying of the greatest Number of Men; Beit therefore Enasted by the Authority, Advice and Consent aforesaid, That it shall and may be
