M. Archibald Buchanan laid before the Committee fundry Papers reliaive to a Cargo of Goods for himself 2070 l. 1 s. 6 d. and for Buchanan and Cowen 598 l. 6 s. 2 d. but as there were no regular Extracts of Letters laid before the Committee, and all the rest of the Papers were taken away under a Promite of returning them, which never has been done, although the Committee repeatedly applied to Messeurs Dick and Stewart for them, as will be shown in the Course of this Narrative, the Public must be content with the best Account the Committee can give from the Notes they took.

1/1, That the Goods for Archibald Buchanan, were wrote for by him in October 1768, to be fent him in the Spring; which Mr. Buchanan did not comply with, for Keasons that

appeared in the Letters.

2d, That the Goods were not ordered, at London, to be bought up, 'til after Mr. Samuel Buchanan's Arrival at London the 15th September 1769.

3d, That Mr. Archibald Buchanan did not expect them.

4th, The following Certificate, from John Buchanan, dated London, 14th October 1769, 112.

HAT those marked A B, & A, configued to Mr. Archibald Buchanan, were wrote for, by his Letter, dated the 29th October last, to be fent him in the Spring, but were not sent. I wrote them per my Letter, dated the 25th February last, if I was fatisfied with his Remittances, before I fent the above-mentioned to Messicurs Dick and Stewart, I would fend them when I fent their Goods; and as I have received fatisfactory Remittances from him, I have now complied with my Promise."

As to the Goods for Buchanan 2 11 Cowen, the Committee had the following Notes, viz. 1/3, That the Goods were wrote in the Fall 1768, to be sent in the next Spring: That Mr. Buchanan fent only Part of them, and wrote them the 20th February, that if their Remittances proved satisfactory, he would send the Remainder in July or August.

2d, That they were not ordered to be bought up at London, 'til after Mr. Samuel Bu-

chanan arrived there, the 15th September 1769.

3d, That they did not expect them.

4th, The following Certificate from John Buchanan at London the 14th October 1769.

HAT those marked B & C, consigned to Messieurs Buchanan and Cowen, are Part of a Cargo wrote for by their Letter, dated the 29th October last, which I did not send in the Spring when the other Part was sent, but wrote them per my Letter, dated the 25th February last, that I would send them in the Fall."

Messieurs. Dick and Stewart produced to the Committee a sealed Packet, indorsed in the Hand Writing of Mr. Dick, "Shop-Notes and Invoice of Goods, belonging to Captain Charles Ridgely, and William Goodwin, on board of the Good Intent, Captain Errington, with Mr. John Buchanan's Letters to them, for the Inspection of the Gentlemen of the Committee at Annapolis." Which being opened, appeared to be Invoices, Bill of Lading, and Shop-Notes of Goods, per the Good Intent, Errington, for Ridgely and Geodwin, amount to 1017 l. 17 s. 5d. and by the Date of the Shop-Notes, appeared to be bought from the 22d September to the 9th of Otteber 1769. 2d,
