B. T. B. Worthington, and Thomas Johnson, Esq; be a special Committee to enquire into, and determine on the Propriety of the Importation of those Goods; and Six Days were allowed to the Owners to appear.

The Committee having thus gone through the Examination of all the Goods and Papers that were laid before them relative to the Cargo of the Brig Good Intent, it was Refelved to call in the Gentlemen Jeparately, and deliver to them the Opinion of the Committee.

Accordingly Mr. Dick was defired to walk in, and the Moderator delivered to him the Opinion of the Committee in the following Words:

of this Province, and it is the Opinion of this Committee that those Goods ought not to be landed.

Goods immediately back to London; and I am defired to remind you of your promifed Acquiescence in the Determination of this Committee, upon the Propriety of the Importation of the faid Goods."

Upon which Mr. Dick desired an Hour's Ti ne to consider of it, and retired.

Mr. Coolidge was then called in, and the Moderator delivered to him the Opinion of the Committee, in the same Manner as to Mr. Dick. Mr. Coolidge made the same Request as Mr. Dick, and retired.

Mr. M'Gachin was then called in, and the Moderator delivered the Opinion of the Committee as before. Mr. M'Gachin made the same Request, and retired.

Mr. Hepburn was then called in, and the Moderator delivered the Opinion of the Committee. Mr. H pburn made some Professions of his Readiness to abide by the Determination of the Committee, and of adhereing to the Association, and retired.

Doctor William Lyon was desired to walk in, and the Moderator delivered the Opinion of the Committee. Doctor Lyon made a very complaisant Bow, and retired.

Mr. Archibald Buchanan was defired to walk in, and the Moderator delivered the Opinion of the Committee. Mr. Buchanan made Answer, that it suited him very well, and for some Time sat down contented.

The Moderator then declared the Opinion of the Committee, as to Messieurs Griffith, Jenings, Andrew Buchanan, Anthony Stewart, John Hall, and Hugh Deans, their Importations, according to the Resolutions on their respective Goods.

The Committee had now finished what Business was before them, and were about taking Notes of their Proceedings, when a Message was delivered from Mr. Dick, desiring longer Time to consult, which was readily admitted. Some Time after, Mr. Dick presented to the Moderator the sollowing Papers, viz.
