N'r. Mille also acquainted the Committee, that it was Dick and Stewart's Desire, that the Committee would publish all the Letters, Extracts, &c.

5 1 R, A T the Pequest of Mr. Maclie, I encl se you Mr. John Buchanan's Certificate, Annapolis, February 11, 1770. relating to the Orders fent him for the Goods thipped in the Good Intent; s hen you have cone with it, you will please return it to me. I likew se, at his Desire, reform you, that the Shop Notes for James Dick and Stewart's Goo's, are dated from funder 22st to the 9th Day of Officher laft. If you want any other Information which I can give you, I shall comply, if in my Power, and am,

ANTHONY STEWART."

A c'vil Answer was returned with the original Certificates, and a Request to Mr. Petturt, Ly Letter, that he would let the Committee have a Sight of the Charter-Party, Manifefts, Rig. and Goodsein's Papers, and any others in his Power, that had ever b. en before the Committee. The Manifells were fent, but no other Papers.

After an Abstract et the Monifetts was taken, the Originals were returned to Mr, Stewart, with a written Requisit for the Charter-Party, and Ridgely and Goodwin's Papers.

A verbal Melicie was returned, they were too bufy then; but were afterwards fent. As the special Committee, viz. Messieurs Johnson, Hortlington, and Paca, determined upon Samuel Drifey, Cribin Lee, and Edward Drife's Goods, before this Account was ready for the Pies, we here infert their Opinions .- See Maryland Gazette, No. 1276.

The tas to Samuel Dergiv's, he wrote for them the 12th of June, after the Anneis widd County Affociation of the 23d of Mar, of which he had due Notice by the Deputy from Elk-Ridge; therefore they refolved, that his Goods were wrote for, and flipped contrary to that Affociation, and ought not to be landed.
