affirmation if a quaker, menonist, or dunker, to wit: "I, A. B. do swear, or solemnly, sincerely, and truly declare and affirm, that as commissioner for county, I will, to the best of my skill and judgment, execute the duties of the said office, diligently and faithfully, according to the directions of an act, entitled, An act to raise the supplies for

the year seventeen hundred and seventy-nine, without savour, assection, or partiality; and that I will do equal right and justice, according to the best of my knowledge, in every case in which I shall ast as commissioner. So help me God."

And be it enalled, That every affessor shall, before he takes upon him the execution of his office, take the following oath, or assirmation if a quaker, memonist, or dunker, to wit: "I, A. B. do swear, or solemnly, sincerely, and truly declare and assirm, that I will well and truly execute the duty of an assessor, and will faithfully, justly, and impartially, assess the pound rate imposed by the act, entitled, An act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and seventy-nine, according to the rates settled

in the said act, according to the best of my skill and knowledge; and therein I will spare no person for favour or affection, nor any person grieve for hatred, malice, or ill-will." Which oath, or assimuation, any one of the commissioners of his county may administer.

And be it enacted, That every person shall be called upon by the assessor of the hundred where he shall reside, to give a sull account on oath, or affirmation if a quaker, menonial, or dunker, (which oath or affirmation the assessor is hereby empowered to administer) the weight of all plate, and the sum or sums of all reads money, either in his own possessor.
