*And be it enacted,* That the said commissioners shall meet together, at the place where the county court is usually held in their respective counties, on Monday the seventeenth day of January next, and as often after as shall be necessary, and the said commissioners, at their said meeting, may appoint a clerk, who shall be paid seven pounds ten shillings per day for his service, and shall by warrant under their hand, appoint one able, discreet and skilful inhabitant in each hundred
