near as may be, according to their ability of body, age, and sex; that silver place be valued at eight shillings and sour pence per ounce, bar iron at thirty pounds per ton, and pig iron at nine pounds per ton; that the other articles of personal property be lest to the determination of the several assessor, who shall value the same in proportion to the rates herein before established for lands and negroes, subject to the controul of the commissioners of the tax, as hereaster directed.

And be it enacted, That the houses and lots in towns and in the city of Annapolis be valued according to their situation and other advantages, in proportion to the rate herein before set on lands.

And. Whereas it may be just and reasonable in some cases to vary from the quantity of acres contained in the patent or deed by which the present possession holds the same:

Be it enacted. That where the affestor shall know of his own knowledge, or have good reason to believe, that there is furplus land held under the patent or deed, it shall and may be lawful for such assessor, and he is hereby required to call on the person to whom the land is affelied, to ascertain the quantity on oath, so be administered by such assessor; and the party so to be affested shall, and he is hereby obliged to discower the quantity, as near as he can, on oath or otherwite, to the satisfaction of the assessor, under the penalty of fifty pounds for every neglect or refusal; and awhere any person assessed holds less than the quantity specified in the patent or deed, it shall and may be lawful for the party assessed, to ascertain the quantity by eath, to be administered as afcresaid, or otherwise 10 prove the same, to the satisfaction of the assessor, who shall rate the land accordingly. And
