peace of their respective counties, or one judge of the general court, with good and sufficient securities, such as the said two justices or judge shall approve, in double the fum to be collected, with condition, "That if the above bound shall well and faithfully execute and perform the several duties required of him by the act of affembly, entitled, An act for the affessment of property within this state, and shall well and truly pay to the treasurer of his shore the several fums of money which he shall receive and be answerable for in virtue of the same act, at such time as by the field act is directed, according to the true intent and meaning thereof, then the above obligation to be void, else to remain in full force and vutue. the faid two justices of the peace, or judge, shall immediately cause the said bond to be proved by the wit. noiles thereto, and thall forthwith endorse the probate on the back thereof, and transmit the said bond to the clerk of the county court, who shall record the fame with the endorsement thereon, and transmit it to the clerk of the general court, who shall immediately record the same bond and endorsement aforesaid, and after entry ther of upon record, the faid clerk shall deliver the original bond to the register of the chancery court, to be by him tafely kept in the chancery office, and an attested copy of the said bond and probate from the faid record, shall be as good evidence in law to maintain an action of debt for the breach of the condition thereof, as if the faid bond or bonds were actually produced and proved in court.

And be it enacted, That each of the faid collectors shall appear at the place of holding the county court for his county, at some time not less than three days before the day of payment herein before limited, the said time of appearance to be fixed by the said com-
