clean merchantable wheat, weighing not less than fitty-eight pounds per bushel, at five shiltings and threepence per bushel; crop tobacco, intected since the
first day of April last, in hogsheads weighing not less
than nine hundred and fifty net, at nuneteen shillings
per hundred, with an allowance of sour per cent for
the cask; good, sweet, fresh, merchantable, sine wheat
flour, packed in such barrels as may by law be exported from Batimore and George-town, at sisteen
shillings for each short hundred weight, with allowance of three shillings for the barrel and nails.

And be it endied. I hat where any person, whose property is chargeable with the rate by this act imposed, shall be under the age of twenty-one years, if the parent or guardian of such infant shall make payment, the same shall be allowed him in his account

with such infant.

And be it enalted, That if an executor or administrator shall have any personal estate of the deceased in his hands, chargeable with the assessment imposed by this act, he may inform the assessment of the rate, the receipt of the collector shall be sufficient evidence to discharge such executor or ad-

ministrator for the sum by him paid.

And be it enacted. That wheat and pork be received in discharge of the tax imposed by this zet, at any of the following places, to wit: at Leonard town, in Saint Mary's county; at Chester-town, in Kent county; at E k-ridge Landing, in Anne Arundel county; at Lower Martborough, in Calvert county; at Port-Tobacco, in Charles county; at Biltimore-town, in Baltimore c unty; at Mile's River Ferry, in Talbot county; at Princes-Anne town, in Somerset county; at Cambridge, in Dorchester county; at the Head of Elk, in Cæcil county; at Upper Mailborough, in Prince George's county; at Corsica creek, in Quren-Anne's county; at Snow-Hill-town, in Wer efter county;
