The Appeal of the senate, and of this house is now made to you as to the propriety and necessity of an emission of paper money circulated on loan, for the purpose of enabling you to pay the heavy but necessary taxes for the support of your own and the federal government; and we wish you to express your sentiments to both branches of your legislature. the present circumstances of our trade, and the heavy incumbrance of your debts to the state and individuals, we are of opinion, that you cannot annually pay, and that too constantly and perpetually, the fum of £116,000 in gold and filver. As the imposing taxes on you must always originate in this house, we were apprehensive if we laid such heavy taxes on you, payable only in gold and filver, which we think is very scarce, and bears no proportion to the amount of the taxes, that you would compare us to the Egyptian task-masters who compelled the Israelites to make bricks without straw. entertain a different opinion from us, and think you can pay the necessary taxes in gold and filver, be pleased to signify your pleasure, and we will immediately proceed to pass laws for the collecting. the sums necessary for the support of this governments and also to defray your proportion of the charges of the federal union.
