Broiler, Versatile Feature in 1/2 inch slices, salt, pepper, Of Modern Kitchen

ECONOMICS

Every family knows how great a broiler is for turning out delicious steaks, chicken and all-American hamburgers. The broiler is a versatile feature of todays' modern gas or electric ranges. Here are some suggestions on how to use it:

1. When your regular toaster can't keep pace with many breakfast guests, let your broiler quickly toast a dozen or so pieces of bread at a time. Keep bread about 2 inches from the source of heat. Turn once and butter hot.

2. Use the broiler for tasty cheese sandwiches. Toast bread on one side. Remove and spread untoasted side with mayonnaise. Add a thick slice of tomato, and cover with a slice of cheese. Top with strips of partially broiled bacon. Broil 2 inches from heat . . . until bacon is done and cheese is melted.

3. The broiler is excellent for gourmet treats such as Crab Imperial and Shrimp Coquille. And a few minutes under the broiler will gently toast dishes with cheese or meringue toppings.

4. Plain cake can be glamorized. Top with brown sugar and chopped nuts, or coconut and honey, and place under the broiler for a few minutes.

Mixed Grills Are Easy And Flavorful

In any season, a mixed grill provides hearty, wholesome food with a minimum of preparation and cooking. Here are some you might like to try:

Broiled Chicken, Bananas and Tomatoes: Place halved chicken on rack 4 to 5 inches from heat. Season, brush with butter. Broil 15 minutes. Cut tomatoes in halves. Sprinkle with salt, pepper and brown sugar. Dot with butter. Turn chicken. Place tomatoes and halved bananas on rack with chicken. Brush bananas with butter, sprinkle with brown sugar. Broil 15 minutes. Set heat control at "Broil" and preheat broiler compartment 5 minutes.

Sausages, Apple Rings and Potatoes: Cut parboiled white potatoes

brush with butter. Cut apples in 1/2 inch slices, leaving skin on. Brush with butter and sprinkle with brown sugar. Arrange apples, potatoes and sausages on rack. Place 3 to 4 inches from heat. Turn sausages after 10 minutes. Total broiling time: about 25 minutes. Set heat control at 'Broil"

Smoked Ham Steak, Pineapple Rings, Glazed Sweet Potatoes and Green Beans: Spread wellseasoned cooked green beans in bottom of broiler pan just long enough to heat. Cut gashes in edge of fat of ham at 1 inch intervals to prevent curling. Arrange drained pineapple rings and thick slices of cooked sweet potatoes around the ham. Brush pineapple and potatoes with melted butter. Place broiler pan 3 or more inches from the heat and cook until a delicate brown. Turn food. Brush pineapple and potatoes with butter and sprinkle with brown sugar. Cook until glazed.


Many Types of Broilers

New types and designs of smokeless broilers are increasing constantly. Because of this, it's wise to follow the instruction booklet for a particular make. Very likely the instruction booklet will also contain some good recipes.

Conventional broiling compartments of gas ranges are under the oven and may be used with or without using the oven. Some ranges have separate broiling compartments which allow broiling or roasting meats without interfering with the use of the oven. Broilers are sometimes located in the top of electric ovens. Broilers may be low, waist-high, or at eye-level.
