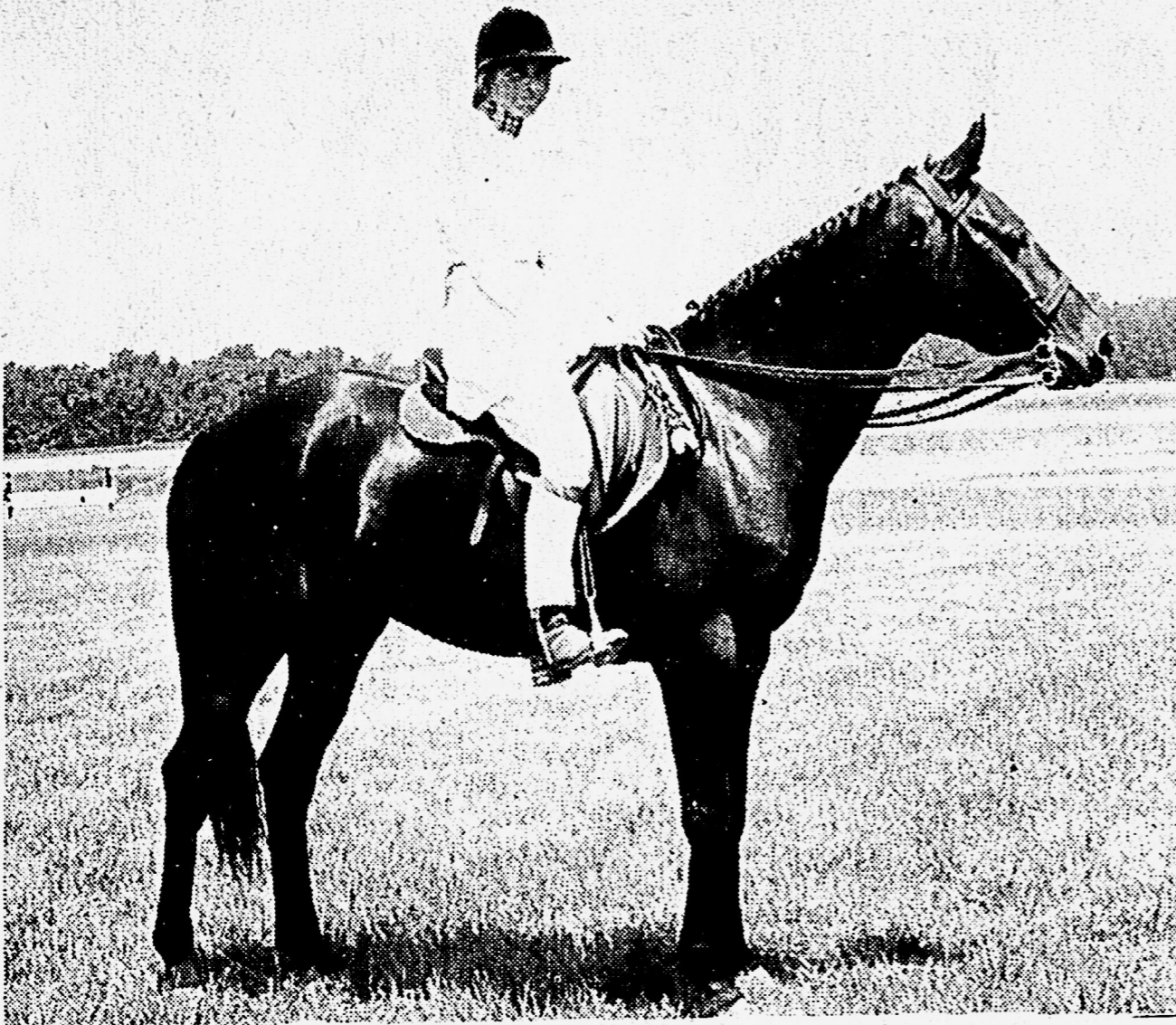
Many local riders also entered the pleasure division classes of the regular show. Winners of ribbons in these classes who live in this area are:

Class 37 - Pleasure Pony - English - 2nd, Sandra Pinder on Treeyews.

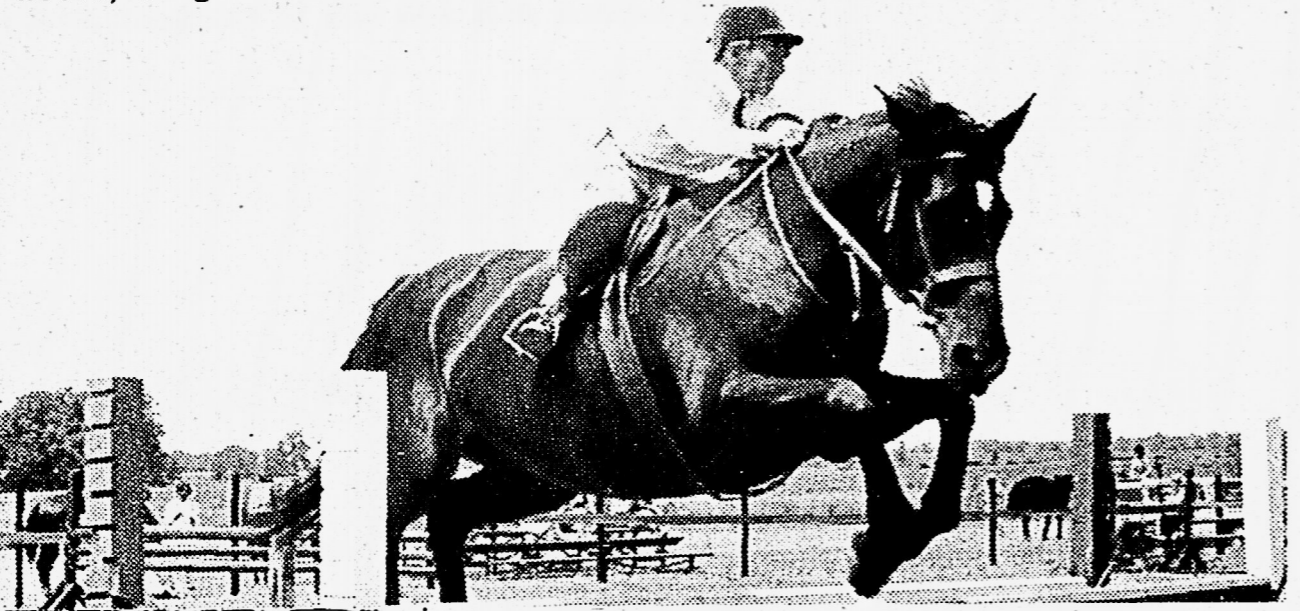

Class 41 Reining (Western) 3rd, Owen Mitchell on Buck.

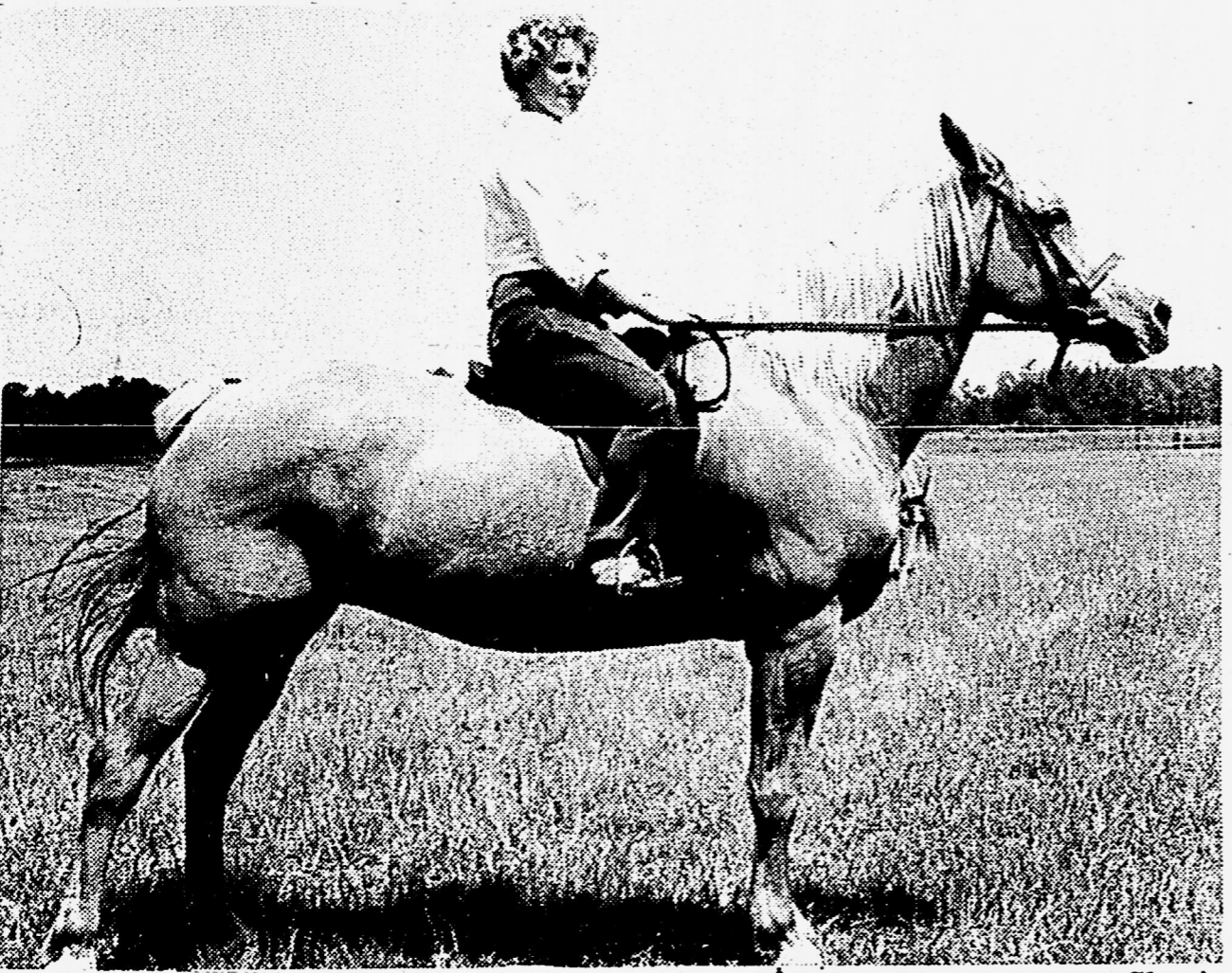
Ninety-nine horses and ponies were entered in the local and pleasure divisions, and the entries were large in most classes, in one as many as thirty.



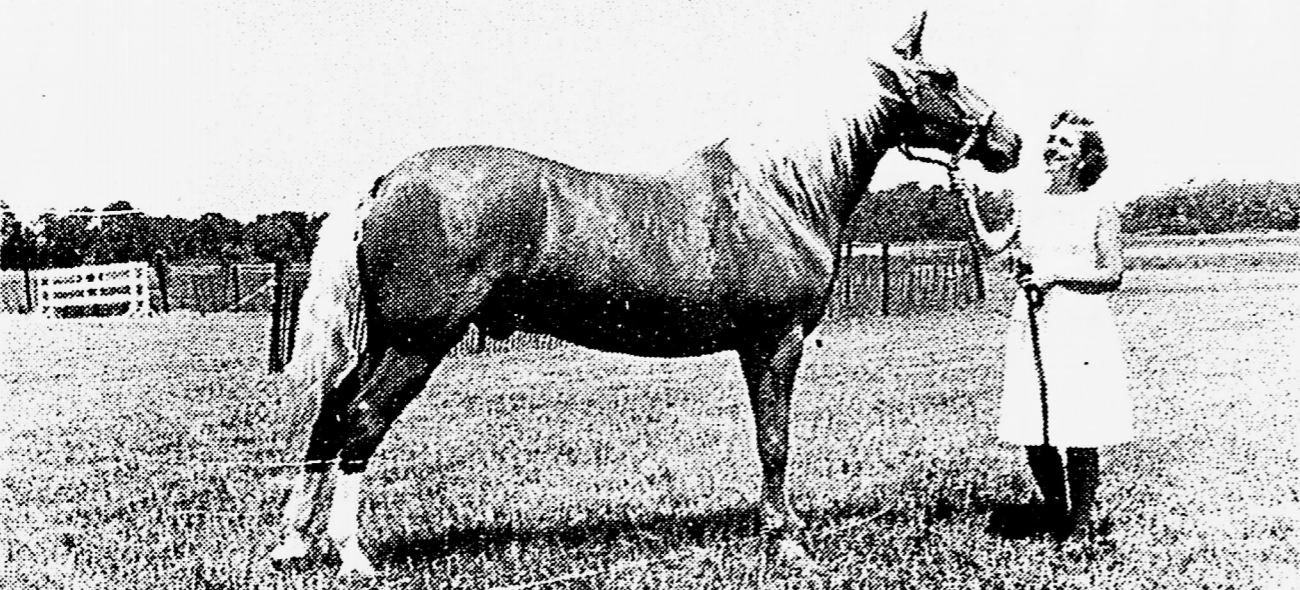
TWO TIME blue ribbon winner at Sunday's Horse show was Sandra Pinder, above, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Pinder.



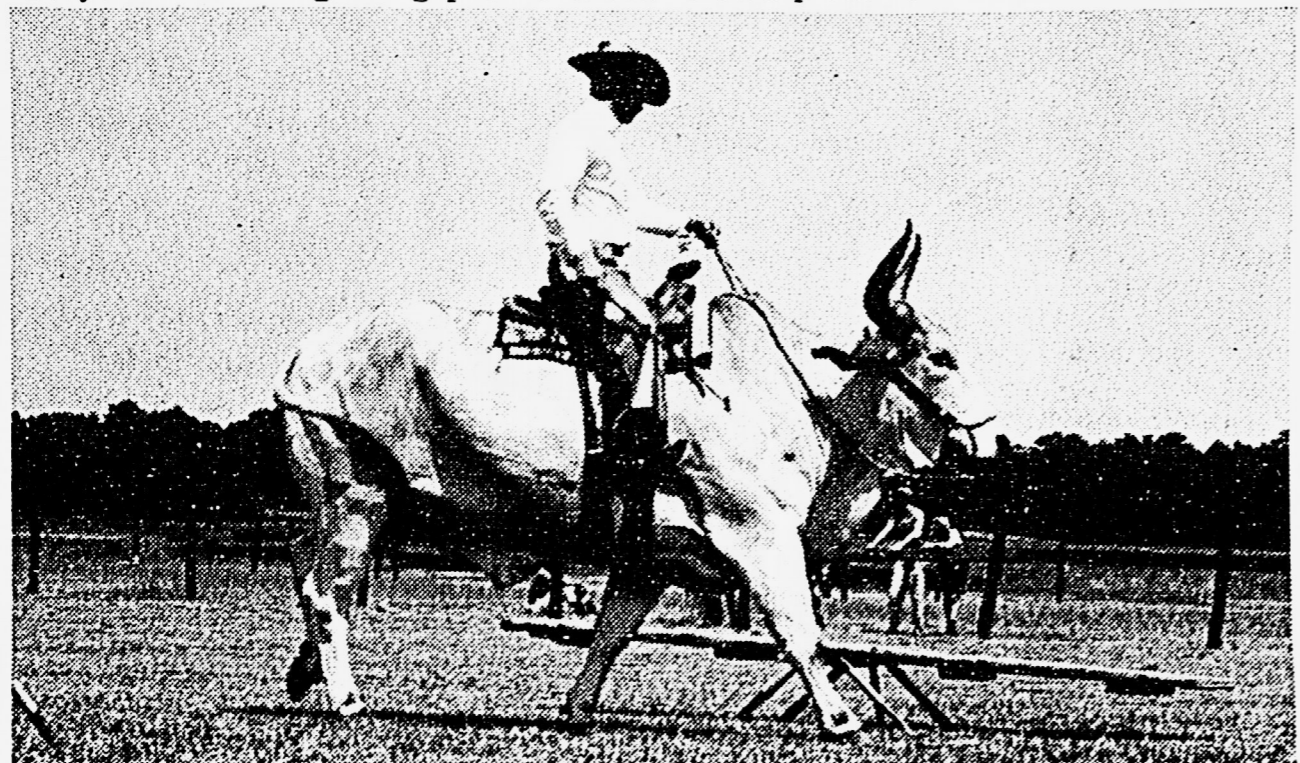
A LITTLE HORSEMAN takes a big jump in Hunter class during last Sunday's Kent County Horse and Pony Show.
