I have found the best results have been for those on the flat lands of the Atlantic States to get their seed from Western States, or from the high mountain section or Pennsylvania; and those who have light soil, free from lime, to get seed from the heavy limestone lands.

For those who prefer white wheat, the South-western States of Western Virginia and Tennesseec. It will also pay the Western farmer to get his seed from the light lands of New Jersey.

Again as we all believe in hybridization, farmers will find a great advantage in getting their seed from three or more different sections and mixing them, selecting those of similar kind and time of ripening.

An example of the success with which wheat may be grown by changing the seed, is shown in the experience of our esteemed fellow-citizen. J. Fewsmith, who did not fail in his wheat crop for twenty years, and who changes his seed every year.

As evidence of what I have said, I refer you to the mercer potato. After it had deteriorated to that degree that a full crop was impossible you found but little in changing with your neighbors, but when you went for your seed to the virgin soil of the prairies of the West, you had good crops again and when you adopted the new varieties you grew crops that exceeded your most sanguine expectations. your most sanguine expectations.

Quick-Paying Fruits.

We are often asked what sorts of fruit pay the best and the speediest? Life is short, say the old and feeble; we are tenants on a short lease, say others, and we want to plant something of which we may rea-sonably hope to gather the product. Can such people be gratified? Let them try;

such people be gratified? Let them try;

1. A. Patch of Strauberries.—If young plants are set out in August or September, they will bear a fair crop the following spring, and a full crop the second season. As to varieties, if one looks only to productiveness, Wilson must constitute the principal crop; but if he has an eye to flavor, let him plant almost anything else. Choose those sorts which are known to be suited to his soil and climate. Of course, too, they must have clean cultivation in summer, and suitable protection in winter.


