Steam Plows.

From "Walks and Talks on the Farm," in American Agriculturist.

"I am surprised," said our English friend, "that you have not steam-plows.—
I have had one on my farm for six years, and we should not know how to get along without it. It is not that it does the work so much cheaper than horses, but it does it quicker and better."—I told him that as soon as we get ride four stumps and clear. without it. It is not that it does the work so much cheaper than horses, but it does it quicker and better."—I told him that as soon as we got rid of our stumps, and cleared the land of stones, we should be ready for the plow. "Why, bless me!" he exclaimed, "I should think you would want the steam engines to pull out your stumps, and stones. I could pull up the biggest stump or stone you have on the farm and drag it up to the head-land."—And really, after going over the farm with him and showing him every impediment that I supposed stood in the way of using steam and hearing his explanations, I cannot see why the steam-plow is not precisely what we want. It appears that it is not on easily worked land like the prairies of the West, that the steam plow is most advantageous, but rather on rough, clayey, stumpy, and stony land. On light easily worked land, horses can do the work about as economically as the steam-engine; but when you want to work a hard, clay soil, ten, twelve, fifteen, or twenty inches deep,—smash it up and tear it all to pieces—there the steamengine can be used to great advantage. It does not plow so well as it will tear it up and pulverize the soil with a gigantic cultivator. There is another advantage that I had not thought of. You can attach a "mole-plow," to the gang of plows or cultivators, that runs down three feet deep and makes a mole drain in the clay subsoil. By providing a proper outlet these drains are nearly as effective as tile drains. No one can doubt that if we could thoroughly pulverize the surface soil, break up the subsoil, and make drains all at one operation, we have millions of acres of land that can be made to produce immense crops with little or no manure. The Devon as a Dainy Cow.—The Devon may be called medium in the quantity of milk, and in its quality superier.—The older, or unimproved race, were somewhat noted for the quantities of milk they produced, as well as its good quality. A gallon of Devon milk yielded more butter than that of almost any other breed, as it does now except the Alderney. But the improvers, in the attainment of a finer form and heavier substance in their animals perhaps sacrificed somewhat of the quantity of milk for the more liberal development of flesh, well knowing that both flesh and milk could not thrive equally together in the same animal; although, when the milk ceased, the flesh came on with due rapidity, under generous feed. Yet, with an eye to breeding her solely for milk, she is well fitted for a dairy cow. Docie in temper, easy in keep, placable in disposition, she is readily managed. Her udder is soft, tidy in shape, with thin, silky hair upon it, clean taper teats, easily drawn, and every way satisfactory to her keeper.

PLANTING VEGETABLES IN OCTOBER OR NOVEMBER.—Lettuce and spinach can be raised nearly a month earlier by planting the seeds late in the autumn, and covering them an inch. Make your beds rich with hen or barn-yard manure for lettnee and spinach; the latter is said to be the best

spinach; the latter is said to be the best test of the richness of the land—it must be well fed to flourish. Cover the beds with leaves, straw, or hemlock-boughs, and, if possible, place boards ever them to retain their coverings.

In April remove the rubbish, and your plants will soon flourish. The careful observer will remember how often lettuce and spinach come forward early in the spring from having sown themselves the previous autumn. revious autumn.
