In addition to this, the process of cooking the amount of food that would be needed for the stock of a farm of ordinary size, would be slow and tedious, as well as expensive; and unless proper attention was given it all the time the cooking was in progress, there would be great danger of having the material ruined by scorching or burning.

For these and other reasons that might be adduced, it is easily understood why farmers who have no other conveniences than those referred to, would naturally come to the conclusion that cooking food for their stock would be attended with more cost than profit. and price of fuel, could be prevailed upon
