Making Butter in Winter.

"Any body can make good butter in the summer." So they say; but we don't find it a true saying. The other part is true, though: "It is the winter that tells the though: "It is the winter that tells the tale." Not one dairy-woman in five hundred can make really good butter in cold weather; that is, butter that will remain good a week after it is made. The difficulties are numerous, thus: The cows have not the best butter-making feed; they have little, if any, coloring matter in their feed; the temperature at which the milk is kept is very unequal; the danger of mixing in the flavors of the kitchen with the milk the cream or the butter is very great. milk, the cream or the butter, is very great; and the butter is too apt to be allowed to become too warm or too cold before it is finally worked into shape.

Over the matter of feeding we can have only a limited control. Nothing that we

can devise is so good as the natural green forage of summer. Our chief attention should be given, then, to temperature, pure air, and artificial coloring, without relaxing, of course, the always indispensa-ble care with regard to perfect cleanliness and perfect working.


