FARM AND HOUSEHOLD. COST OF A SMALL CHEESE FACTORY -As many farmers are making inquir es about butter and cheese factories they will be interested in reading the following estimate of the cost of a small cheese factory, which we clip from the Manufacturer and Builder: "For 100 cows, a building 60x26 feet, with 16 Baltimore & Susquehanna foot posts, making it two stories, would be required. Take 24 feet from the DRAINING TILE lower story for a 'make-room,' leaving 21-2 Inch,

the remainder and the upper story for curing rooms.' The upper story should be partitioned the same as the lower. The 24-foot room over the 'make-room should be plastered and furnished with stoves suitable for curing early and late cheese. The cost depends upon the price of lumber and labor, which differs in localities. A rough, substantial building, which will answer in every respect in the most localties, would cost \$1,000. If finished with paint, etc., \$1,300. It could be furnished with vat, tank, presses, hoops, scales, etc., for \$300, making in all \$1,300 for rough building, and \$1,600 for the finished one. For two hundred cows the same sized building would answer. For vat and fixtures, \$500, making, in all, \$1,500 for rough and \$1,800 for finished building. This is the size of many that were built is this State this season. Stock companies are formed by those interested taking one or more shares, which may be \$50 or \$100 cach. A committee is chosen by the share-holders, who superinted the building of the factory, hiring of help, etc. A dairy of one hundred cows can be managed by a man of experience with additional help, which experience with additional help, which white derived the state of the state o ould be hired at from \$2 to \$3 per day and board. For two hundred cows h would want an additional hand, which I INCREASE THEIR SPEED. might be a woman, and inexperienced The question is often asked: How man cows must a factory number to pay? For an individual to build a factory to work up milk for others at \$2 per hundred, which is the common price of making and furnishing the cheese all boxed and ready for market, he would want three

hundred cows or more to make it a pay-

ing business."

FEEDING FOWLS .- Don't keep food always by your poultry, because, if laying fowls, they are made too fat, and if fattening ones, not fat enough. To fat-ten poultry, feed three times in twenty-four hours all they will eat, and remove all they leave, and they will cat more than when cloyed and disgusted by the constant presence of food. To keep layers in proper condition, feed twice or thrice daily a regular ration, but not as much as they will cat. Some say feed as long as they will run for what you throw to them and eat greedily, but that is not right; for they will get too fat, unless they are laying freely. They will show eagerness about as long as they can swallow, and will scramble for what you give them until in their rivalry they stuff and cram themselves week after week and become a mass of fat and yet they will still act at feeding time as if they were half-starved. Feed your regular laying stock moderately, and be governed by their state of flesh rather than by their greed. Take a few fowls from the perch at night occasionally to test their weight, and a little practice will enable you to quickly decide on the condition of the flock. Increase the ration as the yield of eggs increases, and so long as the laying keeps pace with the diet you may give rich and stimu-lating feed in any quantity. Feed the select breeding stock more sparingly than the rest of the layers, so as to give only a moderate yield of eggs for hatch ing purposes, for if you promote great prolifieness in the parents the result will be weakness in the progeny. Chickens, during the period of their rapid growth, should be fed very often, with a variety,

KINDNESS TO ANIMALS .- The great ecret in raising orderly and tractable nimals, lies in treating them kindly and gently when young. A heifer that is kicked, roughly treated, and occasionally scared into wildness, will probably make a vicious cow, one that will kick or hook occasionally, for she has learned to consider those who approach her as enemies. On the contrary, one that has never learned to fear those who feed or attend her, will submit to the opera-tion of milking without resistance, and can be broken to all the customary duties of a cow with case and safety Give that gentle creature that will turn and lick the hand of her attendant, into the charge of a coarso, ill-natured keeper who will use her roughly, and when she shrinks naturally from such treatment will abuse and beat her, the in stincts of nature heretofore dormant will be aroused, and in fear more than anger she will kick and otherwise resist the unaccustomed cruelty. Here is a plan that never fails, if strickly folowed: take one pint of soft soap, two tablespoonfuls of powdered borax, dis solved in boiling water. Put this mix-ture in a tub, and fill half full of cold BALTIMORE RAILROAD water; put it from two to three blanwater; put it from two to three blankets, as many as the water will well cover. Let them stand from twelve to twenty-four hours. Squeeze and rub them thoroughly, and put them in a basket to drain (over another tub) without wringing. Rinse in clear, cold water, and drain again.
