Notice of Primary Meetings.

The Union Republican Voters of the several Election Districts of Cecil county are requested to assemble in Primary Meetings at the places of holding such meetings on SATURDAY, 16th of September, inst., at 3 o'clock, P. M., and to elect five delegates to meet on the following Tuesday, 19th inst., at 10 o'clock, A. M., for the purpose of nominating three candidates for Sheriff, three candidates for the House of Delegates, three candidates for Judges of the Orphans' Court, one candidate for State's Attorney, and one candidate for County Surveyor, and one delegate to the Convention to be held on the 22nd inst., at Elkton, Md.

Registration.

The Registrars of the several districts will sit at the following places on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, the 18th, 19th and 20th days of September, for the purpose of striking from the lists of registrars, those persons who have died, removed from the State or become otherwise disqualified, and adding to the lists the names of those who have become qualified by age, residence and other conditions. It is the duty of all persons to notify the Registrars of all persons who have removed or died since the last registration.

The County Convention.

The Union Republican Convention which assembled at Elkton, on Tuesday last, was composed of full delegations from nearly all the districts. The delegates represent the party of the county as being in entire unanimity with the great Republican party of the country, and express a quiet, but unanimous determination to go into the fight this Fall with closed ranks and a ticket that will be entirely unexceptionable to the party and the public generally.

The suggestion was made by James T. McCullough, Esq., that the County Convention which will meet at Elkton, on the 19th inst., make arrangements for conducting the most vigorous canvass, after our county ticket is placed in the field, by appointing a committee for each Election District, whose duty it will be to organize the party thoroughly and by systematic efforts bring to the polls every Republican voter.
