These towns are along the coast, and are laid out without regard to coast, and are laid out without regard to regularity. The homes of the poor are low structures of stones, cemented by turf instead of mortar, not more than eight feet high, and covered with a flat roof of turf. The entrance is a long, low, narrow passage, through which we were compelled to pass on all fours. The window is of seal skin, dried, which is white and transparent, Within are benches used as seats during the day and as couches during the night— Within are benches used as seats during the day and as couches during the night—the bedding being composed of reindeer skins. The homes of the danes and of the better class of the natives are larger, more comfortably arranged, and not unlike a small American farm-house. As a whole the Esquimaux are industrious and moral. They hold to the monogamic and not the polygamic form of marriage. The best hunter is the favorite with all the maidens and he experiences no difficulty in winning hunter is the favorite with all the maidens and he experiences no difficulty in winning the hand and heart of the prettiest dansel of the Greenland village. It was my happiness to visit many families in which parental affection and filial love were displayed, and in which comfort waited on simple competence. The paternal rather than the municipal is the form of government under which these people live. When disputes arise between families, and cannot be settled by the parties themselves, the case is brought before the Danish governor, who acts in the capacity of a justice of the peace, and as a court of final appeal the case is laid before the Inspector-General, whose decision is final.
