COOK'S SUPER-PHOSPHATE.

At the present season ewes should be brought into fair condition, both to give them strength to bring forth their young, and to stimulate a good flow of milk.

Care at the same time should be taken not to make them fat, as this is alike extravagant management, and likely to produce inflammatory symptoms at the parturition.

If for any reason it is desirable to have lambs dropped the last of February or the first of March, I know of no kind of grain which will, I may say, maintain an adequate supply of food for the ewe, and turned to pasture.

The man who would raise winter lambs successfully must have in store a liberal supply of roots - clover and turnip - and equal proportion of corn meal and oats as long as the sheep are at the barn, and the flow of milk can be sustained.

Without this liberal feed he will have in May a poor flock, and a poor flock will have in August a poor flock.

The prevailing practice in this section is to have lambs dropped from the first to tenth or fifteenth of April, and from that time on to feed the ewe in the pastures, sheep can be sustained with much less cost and labor.

For this length of time roots can be dispensed with. But as a general rule, roots and oats in equal proportions, though some might wish to add a sprinkling of corn, would leave little to be desired in the way of grain.

The point at which the ewe should be fully grazed for this season. This feed with intelligent care and oversight, will send both ewe and lamb to the pasture in thrifty condition.
