

SPREADING LIME. MR. EDITOR:-In a recent issue, we find your worthy correspondent from North East appears to be in considerable trouble, generally, both in regard to the aristocracy of that town, belonging to the M. E. Church, and the "modus operandi" of spreading lime, by your Elk Neck corres-

Price, 6 cent. 72.50 per year. Address M. J. O'LERNY & Co., P. O. Box 6074, New York. wishes to know if the lime was slaked or quick? It was what we call oyster shell slaked or fell lime. Our intention was to out on 100 bushels per acre. We were on the shore putting on our first loads before sunrise, thereby getting the advantage of the early part of the day. With the three teams we would take from the scow 100 bushels, said scow landing 200 bushels per load. As fast as the teams were loaded they were driven immediately into the field which was adjoining the shore, where there was an extra hand ready to help the drivers in spreading. As soon as they are unloaded, they return direct to the scow to get the three remaining loads, which are driven to the farthest end of the field, to spread, while the scow is re-loading. The ime was shoveled into the wagons and cart by three men, besides the driver, with scoop shovels, therefore requiring but a few noments to load.

Our friend will see that instead of having 20 acres to spread, at 50 bushels per acre, we only had 15 acres to spread, at 100 bushels per acre, making a great difference in els per acre, making a great difference in the numbers to be spread, and distance in driving.

It is no uncommon thing for farmers in our vicinity to use from 75 to 100 bushels of shell lime per acre. I have spread, the past season, 6,000 bushels of lime, with three teams, in six full days; and some of it was hauled at least one mile. A neighbor exceeded my work. He informed me that he landed and spread 1,900 bushels, in one day, with three teams. So your correspondent will see that it

was not spreading quick lime, but spreading lime quick.

EARLY LAMBS FOR MARKET.

Where it is possible to get lambs to market early in the spring, a very profitable business may be made of raising them .-Common native ewer put to a South-Down buck in August, will bring a lamb in the month of January that will fatten more readily (though it may not gain so great a size) than the Cotswold cross. See that these ewes don't want water, and a trough containing a quart of salt with the fourth of a pint of sulphur mixed in, should be placed where they can get to it at any time. With good care most of the ewes will produce twin lambs. A member made the very sensible suggestion that this is due, in a meas-HORSE COVERS, ure, to the fact that the natural enemies of the field mice are so generally destroyed by thoughtless owners of shot-guns. For every boy who has a gun shoots every owl and hawk he can lay his eyes upon, and traps and kills every skunk that sheds his perfume in the fields. This is true. And it illustrates the necessity for a more thorough and universal study of Natural History in our rural schools. Our boys and girls are taught less of what they ought to know and more of what is of no earthly ase to them. Of what is right about them and before their eyes daily they know least -and yet it is a kind of knowledge they will find of most use to them in the practical affairs of farm life. A learned doctor said that the small snakes are also great enemies of mice, and in some countries they are never killed because they are regarded efficient agents in the destruction of these pests. And yet what American farmer boy ever fails to kill a snake if he can find a club or stone to do it with ?-even those snakes that are at least as harmless and beautiful as anything created? The projudice against snakes is something greatly to be regretted. LIME A RENOVATOR OF SOILS .- The constant use of a special manure tends to make the land what is called "sick."-Thus we hear of land being clover-sick; of land that has been manured with superphosphate, guano, or fish, as being burnt, and no longer yieleing to the application of more manure. Barn-yard manure is not yet in sufficient supply to have produced the same effect or given rise to a similar complaint, but even when this has been applied in large quantities to the soil, it will be found that something is needed to remedy the lodging of crops from want of stiffness in the stock or straw. Lime is a iomedy in all theze casez. When the soil is filled with vegetable matter lime rapidly decomposes it, and not only is it a solvent forthis, but for many mineral matters that plants need for food. A limestone soil is as much improved by lime as any other land, and needs it equally at stated periods; for limestone is not lime the sense in which agriculturists use the word it cannot fill the office of lime until it has been fitted therefore by the operation of the
