**Cheese Factories.**

Within the past twenty years the manufacture of the United States has developed into an extensive industry, so that from being dependent upon other countries for our supply of cheese, we are in a fair way of becoming the chief source of supply for that article. In 1855 we imported a million and a half pounds of English cheese, and exported a million pounds of our own. In 1870, however, we exported fifty million pounds, and had an abundant supply for our own use. The co-operative system has been found so advantageous in the manufacture of cheese and butter, that it is estimated that there are now nearly a thousand of these co-operative factories in New York State supplied with milk from a quarter of a million of cows. It is expected that the milk from every three thousand cows will yield a million pounds of cheese, or more than three hundred gallons of milk for each cow.
