To the President: Sir--In pursuance of our instructions we, the undersigned President and Vice Presidents of the National Republican Convention, held in Philadelphia, on the 5th and 6th instants, have the honor to inform you of your election for re-election to the office of President of the United States. As it is impossible to give you an adequate idea of the enthusiasm which prevailed on the unanimity of the Convention, and the choice of the people, we can only add that you received the entire vote of every State and Territory...
