HOW TO FATTEN CATTLE.

The following communication from R. A. Steele, a prominent stock-raiser of this State, to the Drovers' Journal, is full of good sense...

It will and does pay to feed corn to calves and to yearlings. They start out on grass in the Spring, strong and vigorous...

Mammoth, overgrown steers have half year, and are not coming down to the neat, compact, well-fattened animal, both in hogs and cattle.

Mr. George Waring, the excellent manager of the Ogdun Farm, at Newport, N. J., says down the following program...

1. Early the previous Autumn, sow three acres of Winter rye, to be cut the next Spring, from May 15 to June 15.

2. Early in April, sow three acres of oats, to be cut from June 12 to July 1.

3. Late in April, sow two acres of oats or barley, to be cut from July 1 to July 15.

4. Early in May, sow two acres in oats or barley, to be cut from July 15 to August 10.

5. Middle of May, sow two acres of oats or barley, to be cut from Aug. 10 to Sept. 1.

6. Middle of June plant plot No. 1 with corn, which is to be cut from Sept. 1 to Sept. 20.

7. Early in July, sow plot No. 2 with barley, to be cut from Sept. 20 until roots and cabbages in, which is usually Oct. 1 to 15.

8. In September three acres of plots Nos. 4 and 5 are to be sown in Winter rye for the next Spring's use.
