Strict attention should be paid to all parts of the cow-house; sound feed, cleanliness in the stalls, punctual feeding likewise; place the cows according to their temper, not two evil-disposed the other loves a warmer or a cooler spot. The cow-house should be airy, but not exposed to draft. The strewing of straw should be attended tothe more the better for cows, particularly in Winter, when cold. The stalls must be cleaned three times a week. and the feeding floors or troughs swept twice a day. In fact, everything in the cow-house should be calculated to make the animal feel comfortable in it. Perfeet cleanliness throughout the cowhouse, to keep out the stench, should be the rule, else the milk will suffer from it, even during the milking. And here I would call attention to an unpardonable neglect so often met with at cow-houses. I mean the perfect disregard of the valuable manuring fluid which is produced in cow-houses and from dung hills, and which is so often left to run into a ditch or creek near by, instead of being caught in some vat or vessel, and used as a most valuable manure. Yet every farmer knows that without manure worn land cannot be cultivated. One must have seen European farms, where they cannot afford to waste anything, to make this great error in some Ameri can farms right glaring. Currying cows as an act of cleanliness I would recommend, and the daily washing of the udder must be attended to by all means. All this has considerable influence on the health of the cow, as the company of the company well as on the productiveness of milk. It now and then happens that a cow heretofore good, suddenly shows a decrease in her milk. This never should be a reason for neglecting her. On the contrary, she should have a comfortable, clean, airy, but warm place, and the best of feed. She will soon recover, provided an actual disease has not set in. In the tending of calves in the cow-house, special regard should be paid to those which shows the marks of future great milk productiveness, and as such are intended to be added to the stock of the dairy farm.

F. D. Curtis.-The only fault with this article is it does not go far enough. The stable should be cleaned not only once a week, but once a day, and then the windows should be opened to let in a little fresh air and sunshine. In short, a man should treat his cow-stable just as he would his own bed-room. I go further; I take pleasure in giving iny cows a good currying. Cows kept in a stable, especially, need this treatment—it is as necessary to them as washing is to a human being. I have especially noticed this treatment at Beacon Stock farm, on my late visit there, and I never saw better looking

cattle anywhere.

FEED FOR PRODUCING MILK .- The PRACTICAL FARMER says: "It is well settled in the opinion of all our best dairymen, that bran greatly promotes the milk secretions in cows, and it is fed almost universally. About equally mixed with corn-meal is the usual proportion. This mixture seems to promote both quality and quantity of milk. From several sources we hear that buckwheat bran is a great milk-producer, and it is now being used considerably among our Chester County dairymen, in about the same proportions as the

Chester County, also by repeated trials with his own cows, has fully satisfied himself that they do as well with corn and cob-meal and bran as with pure corn-meal and bran. The amount of nutriment in corn cobs is so very small that this result will have to be explained on the supposition of the ground cob, acting to promote digestion by distending the stomach- The presence of bulky material being necessary to pro-mote distension and fill up the stomach of ruminating animals, before perfect digestion can be accomplished, is frequently lost sight of. Hungarlan grass is also found for milch cows to be rather superior to the ordinary run of hay. The last year or two Hungarian grass has loomed up wonderfully in the estimation of our dairy farmers; and a large scope of land will be sowed with it the coming season. It matures for cutting in about sixty days, and produces two to four tons per acre-the latter, of course, on good soils. Three pecks to the acre is the usual allow-ance of seed. Where a good hay market is, substitution of Hungarian grass for common hay in home feeding will be a clear additional source of profit.

FEED FOWLS A LITTLE, AND OFTEN. -It is a very careless method of feed-ing fowls which we see so often adopted, where the grain is thrown down in great heaps on the ground or floor.

It is not only wasteful, but injurious to the fowls, because they get over-fed and it is in an important respect contrary to their habits. For their nature is to "scratch." Watch the old hen with a brood when she is just let out of the coop. She hardly stirs from the spot, but soon as she has realized her freedom, down go her claws into the soil, and afterward, whenever you see her, she

is at it. Always feed, then, no more than can be eaten at once, and take care that it is so scattered amongst some light rubbish, that they may have the luxury of scratching for it. If feed is buried in fresh earth, then they get, with their mouthfuls of grain, something of use to their peculiar digestive organs. Grain, however, should not be allowed to come in contact with the filthy tainted soil too often found in the poultry-yard.

The Poultry World.

SAUSAGE-MAKING AND KEEPING .-To make family sausage, the trimmings and other lean and fat portions of pork are used, taking care that there is about twice as much lean as fat; some consider it an improvement to add about one sixth of the weight of lean beef. As to seasoning, that is a matter of taste. The majority of people use salt, pepper, and sage only, some use only salt and pepper, while others, in addition to the above, put in thyme, mace, cloves, and other spices. There is something repulsive about the intestines or "skins" used for stuffing sausages, and the majority preserve the meat in bulk. In cold weather it will keep for a long time, but if it is desired to preserve it beyond cold weather it needs some case. Muslin bags, made of a size to hold a roll 2 1-2 or 3 inches in diameter, keep the meat very satisfac-torily. These bags, when filled with sausage-meat, are dipped into melted lard, and hung up in a dry, cool place. For seasoning, we use to 100 lbs. of meat 40 oz. salt, and from 8 to 10 oz.




