## An Important Improvement in the Milk House, or Dairy.

From the Maryland Farmer. I depend on the waste of water o the ice house mainly for cooling, which, of course, occasions no more waste than if the temperature of the draining was not availed of, and was allowed to flow away as it usually does. But, in addition to this costless medium, by which to cool the dairy, and to cool at any point in the dairy most desirable, I introduce a thoroughly reliable adjunct, an endless circulation pipe, closed, and the same water is used for an indefinite period; its efficiency being the same for a lifetime, as for a day. 
