THE WATERING OF HORSES.

Correspondent of the Journal of the Farm. As a general rule, where circumstances will allow, horses should be watered from a brook, pond, or river, and not with that from wells or springs. Horses prefer soft water, though it be muddy, to that which is hard, however clear it may be.
In Summer time, horses should be

watered at least four times daily, and for horses of slow work, no limit as to much. quantity will perhaps be necessary, except when warm from severe exertion; but to the horse of fast work a half bucketful at a time. In winter a bucketful morning and evening will ordinarily be found sufficient to answer without causing them to bloat or become pot or heavy bellied. Care however should always be taken that the horse be not put to fast work or severe exertion immediately after drinking a full bucket or quantity of water, because digestion and severe exertion especially water to horses that are often driven give rise to cramps in the stomach or


