THE CULTIVATION OF CORN.

Cor. of The Journal of the Farm.

The cultivation of the young corn plants varies according as to the season and soil, as well as the skill and prejudices, all unhealthy rivalry, all utensils used by the farmer. Some use elfish ambition. Faithful adherence to nothing but the plow, and plow the ground both ways from two to four times, others use the cultivator alone, and cultivate it from three to five times. and others will, as soon as the corn is up, run a harrow over the corn rows to mellow the ground and break up the clods before going over it with the plow and cultivator.

I think the whole art of raising fine crops of corn is in getting the ground in good order before planting. Give them. Their surplus and their exactations diminish our profits.




